

MATERIALS

To do this, you will need:


• Very thin cardboard, like from a box of coffee or milk

Scotch tape

- Glue
- Scissors
- Hole punch tool
- Cutter
- Toothpick




STEPS

Are you excited to do this activity?

STEPS

Me too! Let us begin!






Box

STEP TWO

The box will be the body, make sure that the box is still in good condition and has no damages.



STEP THREE

Get two pieces of thin cardboard. This time, they must be a bit longer and bigger.

2 pieces

Longer wings, better flight quality.



STEP FOUR


Cut them into wings (an upside down right triangle). You can cut or print your own wing design if you want.



You can also stick shorter wings onto the long one to make the wings realistic, like this:

STEP FIVE

Stick the wings onto the body using glue or scotch tape.



STEP SIX


For the tail, get a thin long cardboard (the bottom is thin and pointy and the part that you will connect to the back of the body should be thick, like an upside down vertically long triangle).

Cut it into something like this:

You can make it in any length, it's ok.


STEP SEVEN

Connect the tail to the body using tape/glue. You can get some small triangles (for some spikes) and stick them on the sides of the tail using tape.




STEP EIGHT

Next, are the arms and legs. Cut 4 short thin cardboard pieces. Connect the arms to the bottom of the body or under the wings. Put 3 small triangles for claws, tape them to the arms.



STEP EIGHT

For the legs, you will want to stick them to the very back of the body (3 centimeters away from the tail). Put claws too.




STEP NINE

Now it's time to make the head. Get 2 pieces of small cardboard (as long as an eraser). The 2 cardboard pieces should be long enough to look like stapler bullets.

Jaw should be also like this

Stapler bullets:




2 pcs

Side view

Head can be in any length (jaw and head should have same length).

STEP NINE

Use the hole punch tool to make a hole in the both sides (the ones that are a little to the back) of the pieces.



STEP NINE

Get a really small (it should be long enough to reach the other hole) piece of paper and roll it into a very thin roll, then put it in the hole (cut if it is too long). We will put that for a movable jaw.

The paper when it is still not rolled.



STEP TEN

Get a toothpick and poke it into the front of the body (if it cannot poke through, use a cutter).



STEP ELEVEN

Push the back of the head onto the toothpick until the toothpick gets through. (The toothpick can be the tongue). Get two small left side triangles. Glue them to the upper part of both sides (the ones that are a little to the back), these will make the ears.



STEP ELEVEN


The toothpick can be both the neck and the tongue.

STEP TWELVE

Finally is the exciting part, add some designs to it! You can draw or cut out the eyes and also put small pointy teeth inside the mouth. You can also color it to make it look lively.



Features & About Appearance


Features:

- It flies smoothly and lands slowly
- Movable jaw
- You can add some extras inside the empty space in the body (box), like dragon organs or a mythical dragon stone.
- You can put fake food in its mouth
- You can make some seats on the back of the dragon so you can put figures
- It can be used for stop motion videos

Features & About Appearance

About Appearance:

- Realistic
- Easily identifiable as a dragon (you can already tell that it is a dragon)



Tips and Recommendations

Tips:

- Putting the dragon in front of a fan while moving it up and down will make it look like it's flying
- Raise the dragon in the air while in the sunroof will more make it look like it's flying (just make sure that no parts fly away)
- Run while raising the dragon in the air. Running is an exercise to humans, and flying for dragons. (You and your dragon can be exercised)



Tips and Recommendations

Recommendations:


- You can use a pringles container or a whole box to make the body of the dragon so you don't have to use cardboard
- Use stands to make the dragon do a pose
- Maybe next time, you can make a bigger dragon, a VERY BIG one (but you will have to use real cardboard)!
- You can also use colored paper (but it will break more easily)
