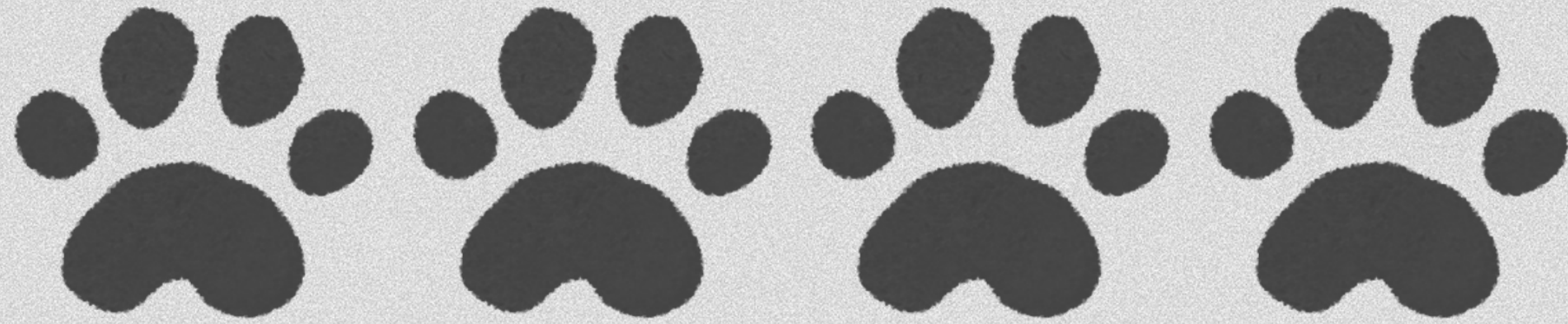


Munchkin Cat

Siberian Cat

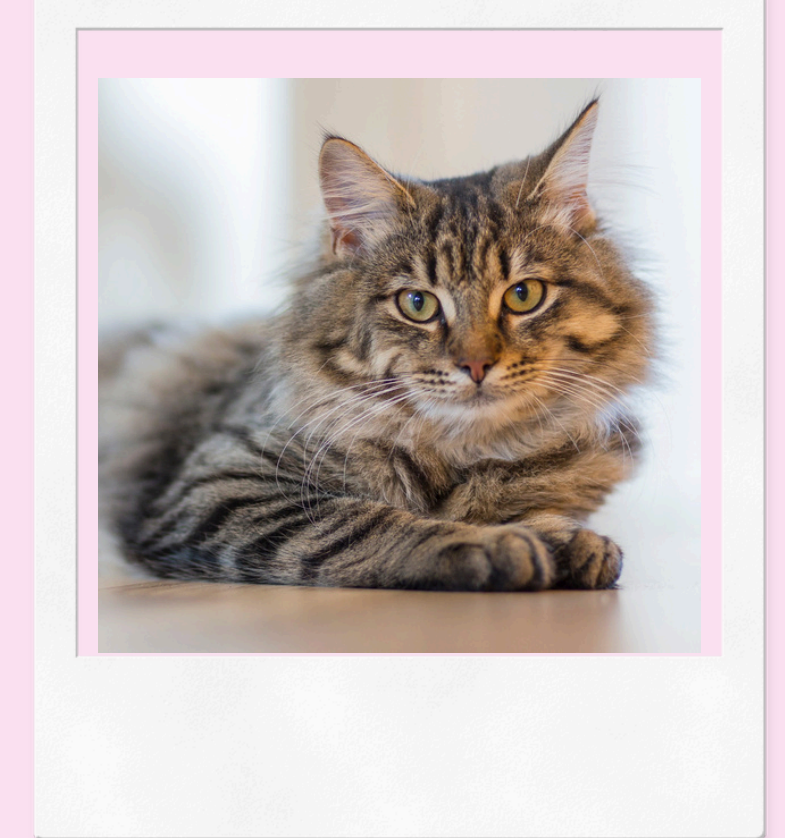
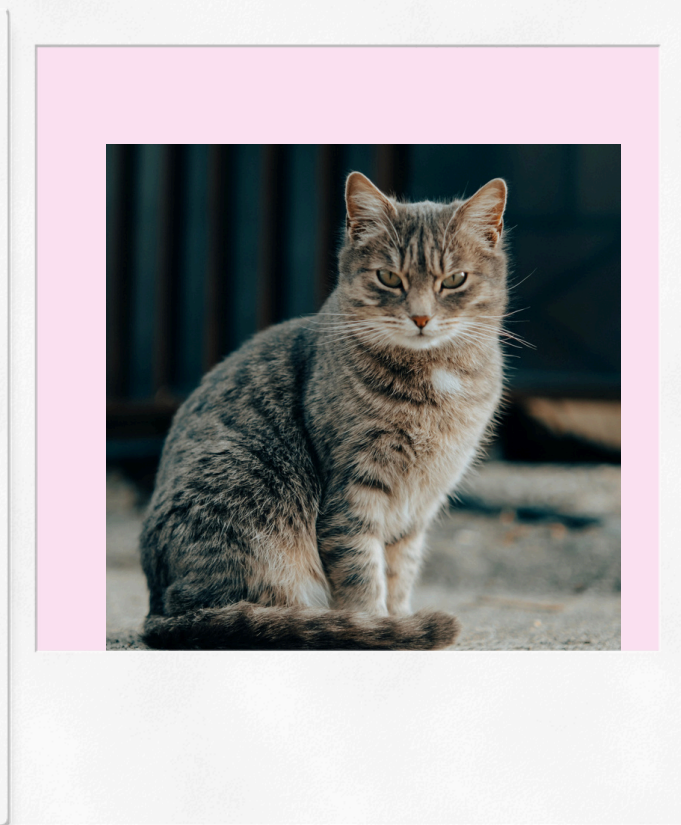
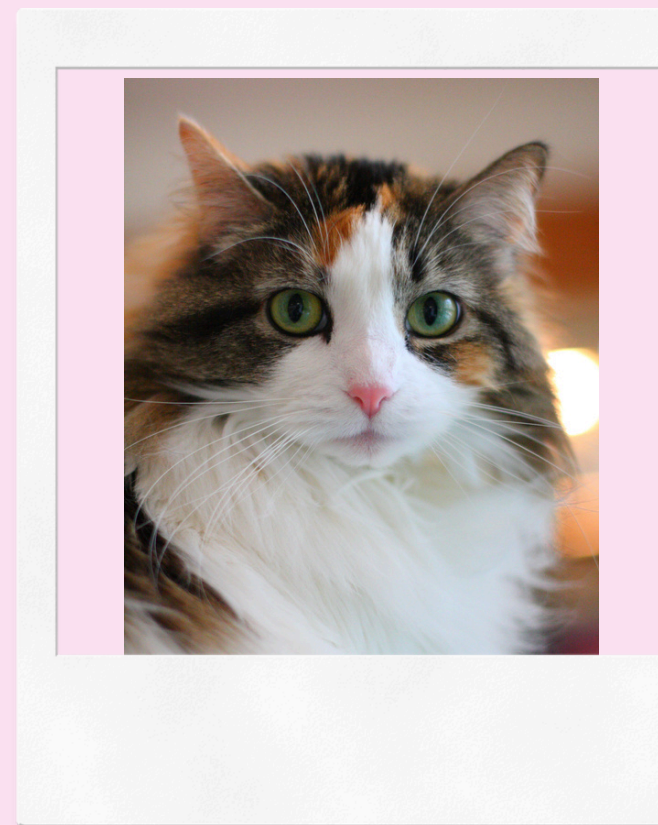


History
