THEIR physical Characteristics



How did they adapt?


They adapted by hiding in caves because of their brown fur that they will not be seen inside the cave and they also have claws and sharp teeth to hunt food and defend themselves from other predators.





 Polar bears actually don't eat humans if they are not hungry.


 Polar bears live in one of the planet's coldest environments.
